



especially when regarding contracts or business with the town and legislation. Chairman Clifford responded for Mr. Martin to elaborate when he said it is too inclusive.

Mr. Martin stated his concerns when it comes to disclosures of Town matters vs. private work matters, non-town related. He gave the example of his private practice clients being disclosed and violating the rights of his clients as according to HIPA laws. It could be a problematic issue and some private businesses do not pertain to town business.

Mrs. Carpenter then stated where one would draw the line between spouse and family. If a spouse was doing business with the town, the town should be aware of such.

Mrs. Felser reported that when it came to who should file financial disclosure, all elected officials, department heads, Zoning and Planning Board members, and Board of Assessment Review. Other boards such as the Library Board and even the Ethics Board shouldn't need to provide one. Mrs. Felser agreed that if that person is doing business with the town, it needs to be disclosed.

Mr. Manley stated he does not agree with annual disclosure statements.
