ISSUES OF THE PUBLIC

RESIDENTIAL SIGN

Steven Zatko requested permission to put a 3' x 5' sign in front of his house for the month of October to display names of those affected by breast cancer.

Code Enforcement Officer John Gullo stated he will place this item on the next Town Board Agenda and Town Attorney John Fenz will present a formal proposal with his recommendation.

QUASAR AND NEW YORK PRIZE GRANT PROGRAM

Doug Kroll commented on a discussion at a previous Town Board meeting concerning running electrical cables to Town Hall and other town buildings from a generating station in the Industrial Park and stated he considers this an odd idea when generators were just installed at the Highway Department, Town Hall and Senior Center.

Town Engineer Steven Tanner responded the process currently being discussed is called New York Prize, a state-sponsored grant program the town is pursuing. The grant would fund a microgrid program in town that could provide electricity during emergency situations and incorporates newer, larger-capacity solar panels that can store power for times of need. The microgrid will also have the ability to generate power using sources from local facilities such as Quasar.

Mr. Kroll expressed concern about the use of equate at the Quasar plant and commented the Marilla Town Board voted unanimously against using equate. He suggested contacting Senator Gallivan and ask that he sponsor Home Rule Bill A5260 to add state support to this position.

ISSUES OF THE PUBLIC

QUASAR AND NEW YORK PRIZE GRANT PROGRAM (continued)

Mr. Tanner stated Quasar indicated to the town they will be using sewage leftover from dairy processing, which if processed properly does not have the issues related to equate. Mr. Tanner does not feel this is a danger and stated it is heavily regulated by the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC).

Supervisor Meegan commented the products going into the plant at this location are from Rosina Meats, Rich Products and other local restaurants.

Amy Carpenter questioned the status of the moratorium on Quasar and if only energy is being produced at the facility, not fertilizer.

Supervisor Meegan responded the moratorium expired, but she did not believe Quasar is running 100 percent at this point because they only run the system when it has reached full capacity. She further confirmed only energy is currently being produced.

Susan Kims referred to the covered dump trucks coming into Quasar and questioned if they are carrying sewage sludge. She further questioned if Quasar anticipates producing energy soon.

Mr. Tanner responded Quasar's permit is written for food and dairy waste. The DEC oversees testing of sludge and sewage waste is highly regulated if it is being brought in. Mr. Tanner further stated production of energy is imminent.

SPCA LOCATION IN WEST SENECA

Amy Carpenter requested an update on the proposed SPCA location in West Seneca.

Code Enforcement Officer John Gullo responded the infrastructure is being put in at this time and building drawings are being redone.

Town Engineer Steven Tanner added there were issues with the sewer in some areas of the property so they are working on modified building designs that won't impact the sewer system, noting this might slow progress a bit.

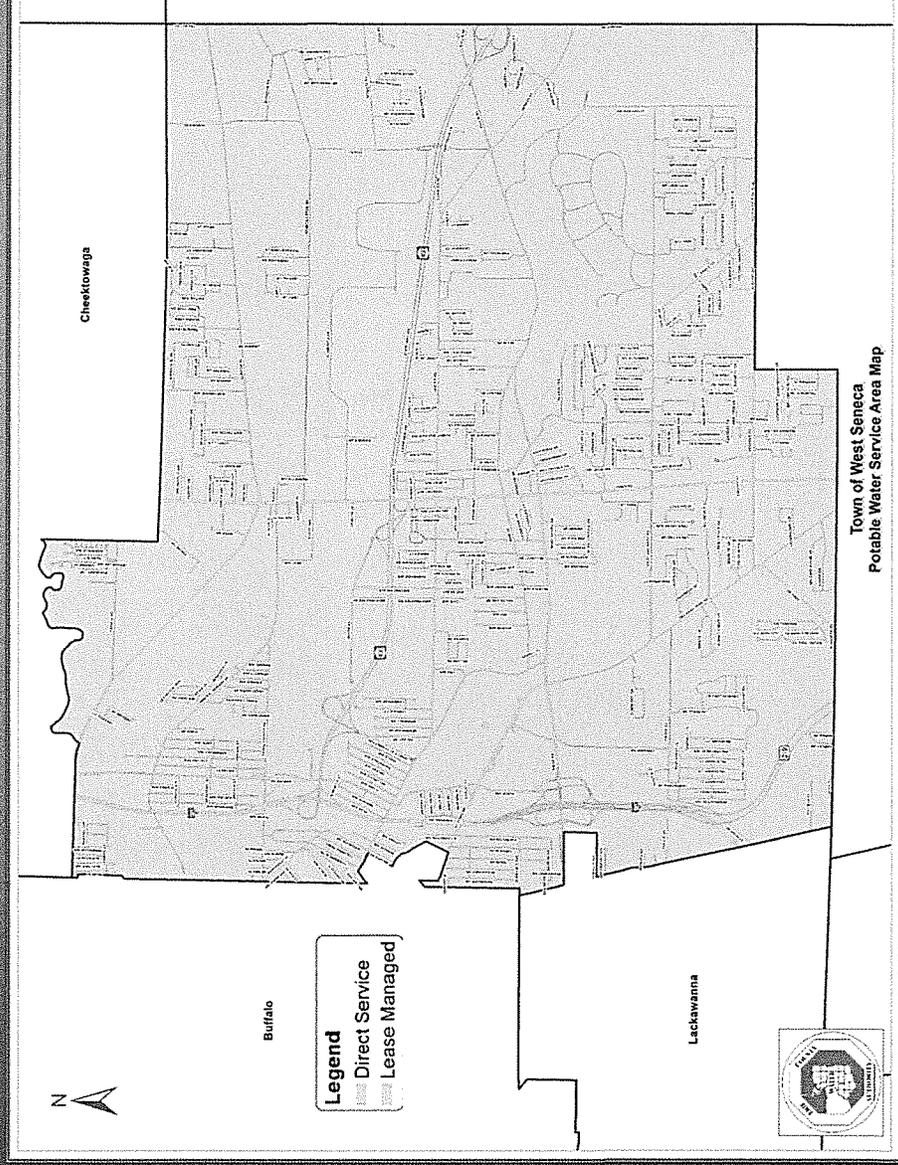

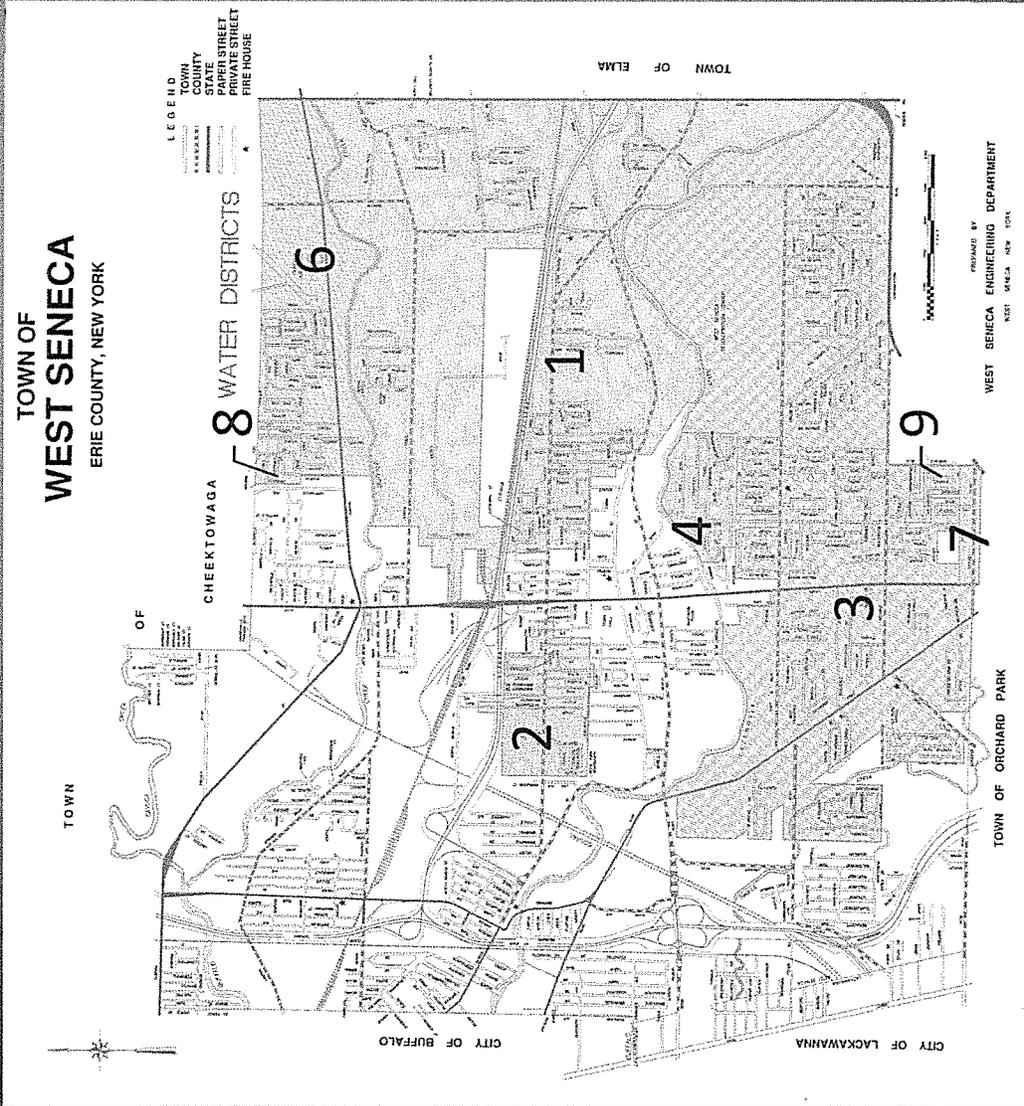

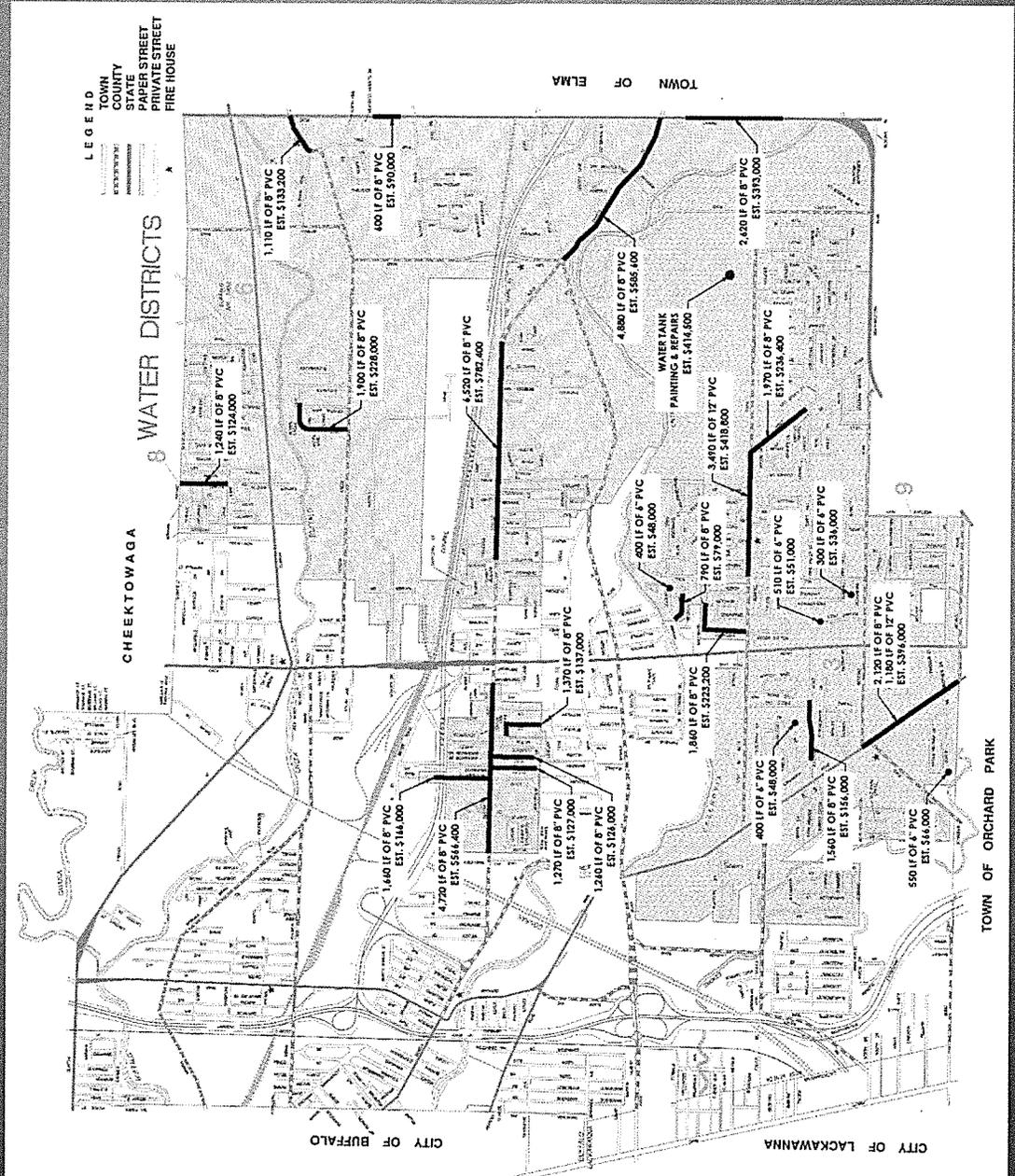

RESOLUTION AND ORDER AFTER PUBLIC HEARING
HELD ON MAY 11, 2015, FOR THE INCREASE AND
IMPROVEMENT OF WATER SYSTEM FACILITIES FOR
WATER DISTRICTS 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 AND 9, PURSUANT TO
SECTION 202-b OF THE TOWN LAW

WHEREAS, the Town Board has undertaken proceedings pursuant to Section 202-b of the Town Law for the joint increase and improvement of water system facilities for Water Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 and 9 (herein called the "Districts") in the Town of West Seneca (herein called the "Town"), in the County of Erie, New York, in preparation for the eventual conversion to a Direct Service contract with the Erie County Water Authority for the benefit of water system users in the Districts, including construction of improvements to approximately 43,000 linear feet of watermains and the water storage tank located off of East & West Road approximately 1000 feet west of Leydecker Road, and replacement of approximately 55 existing hydrants; and

WHEREAS, a map, plan and report dated January 2014 were prepared by Clark Patterson Lee, engineers duly licensed by the State of New York (herein called the "Engineer"), as supplemented by letter dated April 17, 2015 from the Engineer, for such increase and improvement of facilities of the Districts and the estimated cost of the project is \$8,000,000, of which \$400,000 is to be funded from Local Government Efficiency Grant funds expected to be received by the Town on behalf of the Districts and \$7,600,000 is proposed to be financed through issuance of bonds by the Town on behalf of the Districts; and

WHEREAS, the map, plan and report and an estimate of cost have been filed with the Town Board, and the Town Board has adopted a Resolution describing in general terms the

proposed increase and improvement of facilities of the Districts, specifying the estimated cost thereof, and stating that the Town Board would meet to hear all persons interested in said increase and improvement of facilities on May 11, 2015, at 7:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) at the Town Hall, in said Town; and

WHEREAS, a Notice of such public hearing was duly published and posted pursuant to the provisions of Article 12 of the Town Law; and

WHEREAS, such public hearing was duly held by the Town Board on the 11th day of May, 2015, at 7:00 o'clock P.M. (Prevailing Time) at the Town Hall, 1250 Union Road, West Seneca, New York, and discussion on the matter having been had and all persons desiring to be heard having been heard, including those in favor of and those in opposition to said increase and improvement of the facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board, as lead agency, has given due consideration to the impact that the increase and improvement of the facilities of the Districts may have on the environment and the Districts has complied in every respect with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations regarding environmental matters, including compliance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), constituting Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and the applicable documentation thereof has been filed in the office of the Town Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has reviewed a Short Environmental Assessment Form prepared and signed by the Town Attorney and by resolution duly adopted on May 12, 2014 has determined that the project is an unlisted action and will not have a significant impact on the environment;

NOW, THEREFORE, on the basis of the information given at such hearing, it is hereby

DETERMINED, that it is in the public interest to increase and improve the facilities of the Districts, as hereinabove described and referred to, at the estimated maximum cost of \$8,000,000; and it is hereby

ORDERED, that the facilities of the Districts shall be so increased and improved and that the Districts and the Engineer shall prepare plans and specifications and make a careful estimate of the expense for said increase and improvement of the facilities of the Districts and, with the assistance of the Town Attorney, shall prepare a proposed contract for the execution of the work, which plans and specifications, estimate and proposed contract shall be presented to the Town Board as soon as possible; and it is hereby

FURTHER ORDERED, that the expense of said increase and improvement of facilities shall be financed by the issuance of not to exceed \$7,600,000 bonds of the Town, together with \$400,000 Local Government Efficiency Grant funds expected to be received by the Town on behalf of the Districts, and the costs of said increase and improvement of facilities, including payment of principal of and interest on said bonds, shall be paid by the assessment, levy and collection of assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land within the Districts in the same manner and at the same time as other Town charges; and it is hereby

FURTHER ORDERED, that the Town Clerk record a certified copy of this Resolution and Order After Public Hearing in the office of the Clerk of Erie County within ten (10) days after adoption hereof.

WHEREAS, following preparation of a map, plan and report for the increase and improvement of water system facilities of Water Districts 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 and 9 (the "Districts") in the Town of West Seneca (herein called the "Town"), in the County of Erie, New York, and after a public hearing duly called and held, the Town Board of the Town determined that it is in the public interest to increase and improve the facilities of the Districts, and ordered that such facilities be increased and improved;

Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF WEST SENECA,
IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of
all the members of said Town Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town hereby appropriates the amount of \$8,000,000 for the increase and improvement of facilities of the Districts, as described in the Resolution and Order After Public Hearing adopted on May 11, 2015, all in accordance with the map, plan and report prepared by Clark Patterson Lee, engineers duly licensed by the State of New York, as supplemented by letter dated April 17, 2015 from such engineers, on file in the office of the Town Clerk and hereby approved. The estimated maximum cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$8,000,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$7,600,000 bonds to finance a portion of said appropriation, the application of \$400,000 New York State Local Government Efficiency Grant funds expected to be received by the Town on behalf of the Districts which shall be used to pay a part of the cost of the project, and the assessment, levy and collection of assessments upon the several lots and parcels of land within the Districts in the same manner and at the same time as other Town charges, to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds.

Section 2. Bonds of the Town are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$7,600,000, pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance a portion of said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

(a) The period of probable usefulness of the specific object or purpose for which said bonds are authorized to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 4. of the Law, is forty (40) years.

(b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

(c) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will exceed five (5) years.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes issued in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the

authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and the powers and duties relative to executing contracts for credit enhancements and providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, are hereby delegated to the Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

- (a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or
- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary thereof, are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

- (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This bond resolution shall take effect immediately, and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing resolution, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of the Law in the "*WEST SENECA BEE*" a newspaper having general circulation in the Town and hereby designated the official newspaper of the Town for such publication.

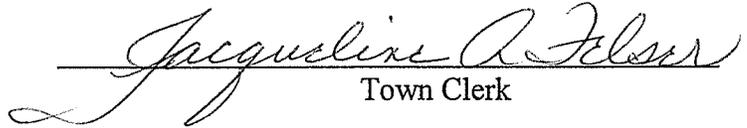
