





Town Attorney Chris Trapp stated another modification to address an internal inconsistency between 11-3(A) and 11-3(B) will also be discussed.

Councilman Cantafio requested clarification regarding the statement "representing the West Seneca Central School District," for example, it could be a parent or an employee, not necessarily an employee of the district, they can be a member of a commission or a parent. Mr. Trapp stated this is correct. Councilmember Piekarec questioned if this means any citizen. Mr. Trapp stated the school district may suggest three people that have an interest in the recreation program.

6. Town Attorney re Out of District sewer agreements

Motion by Supervisor Dickson, seconded by Councilmember Cantafio, to authorize the Supervisor to execute all necessary documents and agreements with Maranno/Marc Equity Corporation as they pertain to 6999, 6987, and 6975 Reserve Road in the Town of Orchard Park connecting to the Town of West Seneca Sanitary Sewer District No. 13.

Town Engineer Steve Tanner stated the amount of water being added to the sanitary system is reviewed when deciding to make the agreement and the town can charge an increased rate. There are currently several agreements with properties in Orchard Park and a few in Elma. Town Attorney Chris Trapp stated the town would charge the same rate proportionally as the other ones.

Councilmember Kims questioned why the town does this when the town's system is already taxed, and how does this benefit the town. Mr. Tanner stated the DEC requires connections when sewer systems are available; they do not want septic systems. The other factor considered is the average daily flow amounts for each agreement, approximately 600 gallons per day, and this would not add a substantial amount to the system.

Councilmember Kims questioned if there is another option. Mr. Tanner stated there is not another option, other than putting in a septic system.

Councilmember Piekarec questioned if any West Seneca Properties have agreements with Orchard Park, Lackawanna, Mr. Tanner stated he is not aware of any, but there are Erie County sewer districts in the town and residents pay the county for their sewers.

8. Town Engineer re Bid Awards for Plant 5 Flowmetering – General

Motion by Supervisor Dickson, to award the bid of the Wastewater System Improvements – Plant 5 Flowmetering Project – Contract 1 General to Kandey Company, Inc., in the total bid amount of \$2,986,089.

Town Engineer Steve Tanner stated the DEC consent order requires the town to have flowmetering at Plant 5. The town had hired GHD to do the engineering for the project. The purpose of the flowmeter is to accurately account for all the water West Seneca is sending to the Buffalo Sewer Authority and it will measure the amount that is over the allowed amount. The current equipment does not accurately measure surges. Supervisor Dickson questioned if the Buffalo Sewer Authority knows how much water is going into their system. Mr. Tanner stated in his opinion they do. Supervisor Dickson stated the town did enter a consent agreement, but this project does not mitigate the water entering residents' basements.

Councilmember Piekarec questioned the legal ramifications the town would face if they do not go forward with this project. Town Attorney Chris Trapp stated he anticipates the DEC to approach the town sooner rather than later. Supervisor Dickson questioned if it is required now. Mr. Tanner stated according to the consent order it is required to be completed by the end of this year; but the town would need an extension due to lead times of materials.

Supervisor Dickson stated there is another \$3M project to slip line the next phase of the ten phase project. Mr. Tanner stated all the projects would roughly be \$12M; CPL is going to apply for grant funding for phase 8 but the metering project would not be eligible for grants.

Supervisor Dickson stated he would prefer to table this item and the electrical contract. Councilmember Piekarec stated he believes the town has extended it twice and asked if this would put the town in a weaker position. Mr. Trapp stated the town would have a better argument for an extension if they approved this now and waited for the materials versus choosing not to do the work. Supervisor Dickson stated the town should be doing the work that impacts the water getting into the system first.

Supervisor Dickson questioned the timeline of the consent order. Mr. Tanner stated the consent order was signed in 2004 and the town completed some work through 2010. In 2010 a new consent order was given to the town to address overflows. The initial plan was to line three to four phases of sewers and then evaluate the results. A revised consent order was signed in 2019. Currently another revision has been issued by the DEC and the town is negotiating this.

Supervisor Dickson stated the DEC took two years to review and respond to the plans the town submitted for the current project. Mr. Tanner stated that is correct and the DEC is still reviewing upgrades to pumps near the high school. Supervisor Dickson stated the town is not against improvements that reduces diluted sewage into creeks or keeping it out of people's basements but spending it on the flow meter project is not the priority.

Councilmember Piekarec questioned the ramifications for tabling this regarding the bidding process. Mr. Trapp stated most bids have 30 – 45 days.

Councilmember Cantafio stated he agrees with Supervisor Dickson's statements but would like to be certain the town will not be financially penalized.

The motion failed for lack of a second.

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Community Rummage Sale on June 4th

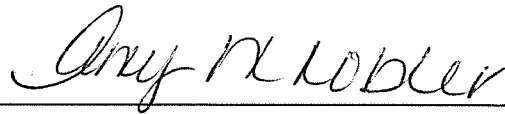
