

A MESSAGE FROM POLICE CHIEF BRIAN COSGROVE

As we begin the transition into the fall and winter seasons, I'd like to make mention of a few important things to keep our community safe:

- ⇒ **See Something, Say Something:** Our community is a tremendous resource to us and an asset to keeping our community safe. If you see a crime in progress or something that "just doesn't seem right," give us a call. By being alert and reporting suspicious activity to your local law enforcement, you can protect your family, neighbors, and community.
- ⇒ **Unattended Vehicles in Winter:** As we get into colder mornings, it often doesn't seem like a big deal to
 - start our vehicles in the driveway and leave them unattended to warm up or run into a convenient store "real quick" and leave your vehicle running in the lot. Please be aware that this creates a prime opportunity for someone to drive off with your vehicle. By keeping vehicles off and locked, you can keep yourself from becoming a victim.
- ⇒ Scams: The holiday season, unfortunately, is a time when criminals often try to take financial advantage of others. Be aware of the risks by avoiding phone calls from numbers you don't recognize, opening emails that aren't from someone you know, particularly claiming to be from the post office or another delivery service and that they need you to follow a link to straighten out a delivery issue. Being vigilant can save you from financial harm.



PARKING BAN

Starting December 1st, West Seneca's winter parking ban will run nightly from 1 a.m. to 7 a.m. until March 15th. Typically, this ban begins on November 15th, but due to the mild weather we're giving you a few extra weeks to prepare.

The purpose of the ban isn't to complicate parking- it ensures our snowplows can safely clear the roads without any obstacles. Storms can be unpredictable, and the parking ban ensures the streets can be cleared for any surprise storms. A parked car means a plow has to go around, leaving messy

patches that make travel tricky for everyone. Please help us keep streets safe, clear, and accessible (and avoid parking tickets) by following the parking rules. Thanks for helping us keep West Seneca moving smoothly this winter!

A MESSAGE FROM... TOWN CLERK KATE NEWTON

It is hard to believe how fast this year went by. January 1st was my first day in office, I had New Year's Resolutions, hopes and wishes for 2024. Hopes and wishes came true, resolutions—well there is always next year!

The office has been actively working together this past year and these ladies have been rockstars! The school tax collection was where they shined. On Tuesday, October 15th (last day without penalties) we interacted with over 900 residents in person at the office. In comparison to the 2023 School collection this was a 38% increase in traffic at Town Hall. Our residents also deserve a special shoutout, they were patient and understanding the whole day. Some comments I heard were: unprecedented, never saw so many people pay on the last day, guess everyone wanted to pay in person, was not a long wait and worth it.

Starting in January 2025 we will have our agendas and minutes on a new platform, CivicClerk. That partners right alongside the new website for the Town that will be launched in 2025.

2025 TOWN & COUNTY TAXES

The next tax collection period will be for 2025 Town & County. Tax bills should be printed and ready for pickup from Erie County in mid January. The last day

to pay without penalties is Tuesday, February 18, 2025. The office will be closed on Monday, February 17, 2025, however the office will be opened on Saturday, February 15, 2025 from 9 am to 12:30 pm. Please also note there is a secure dropbox located just inside of Town Hall on the left side mounted to the wall. The box is available at anytime day or night and is routinely checked.

If you do not receive your tax bill by the end of January, please call the office and we can reprint it for you.

DEC

The DEC (Department of Environmental Conservation) experienced difficulties acquiring the Valeron stock paper and moved to plain paper. Hunters were quite surprised and we hope to gain helpful feedback after the hunting season to share with the DEC.





SNOWPLOW PERMITS: The Town requires snow removal contractors to obtain a license to conduct business in the Town. This is an annual license that must be

renewed to allow snow removal for residential or commercial properties. This ordinance will assist in providing the safety of residents and ensuring the individual hired is licensed and insured. Each vehicle requires a separate permit and must have the official town sticker affixed to the vehicle's window. Please note that per the town's zoning ordinance, it is the responsibility of the property owner to keep sidewalks clear of snow.

WHAT ELSE WE DO

Getting Married

Marriage Licenses are issued daily from 9am to 4:30pm. The fee is \$40.00 and the applicants must appear together. The license is valid anywhere in the State of New York. Please check out the Town Clerk/Receiver of Taxes' webpage for the list of required items that are needed for the application. Appointments are requested.

Accessible Parking Permits

There is no fee for accessible parking permits. We just need the application form signed by your physician and your driver's license. We issue the parking permit while you wait.

Dog Licenses

NYS law requires all dogs four months or older to be licensed and have updated rabies vaccinations.





EMERGENCY INFRASTRUCTURE

The Town of West Seneca has taken major strides to fortify its emergency infrastructure, installing new backup generators at critical facilities to support the community during natural disasters and extreme weather events. In addition to the recent installation of a generator at the West Seneca Senior Center to create an emergency shelter, new backup generators have also been added to key sanitary pump stations. This extensive preparedness plan is designed to ensure that essential services and community safety resources remain available when residents need them most.

GENERATOR INSTALLATION

Senior Center

The installation of a generator at the Senior Center will allow the facility to operate as a fully functional emergency shelter during power outages and severe winter weather, offering warmth, lighting, and a safe gathering place for residents. By transforming the Senior Center into a staging area for emergency personnel, it enhances the town's ability to coordinate response efforts, distribute resources, and provide immediate shelter, particularly valuable for seniors and other vulnerable community members.



Sanitary Sewer Pump Stations

The backup generators at Plant 5 and Plant 12 (at Maryon and Bernadette) are vital for maintaining essential sanitary services in the face of power outages or extreme weather events. Power outages can jeopardize pump station operations, leading to sanitation disruptions that affect health and safety. These new generators will keep the stations fully operational, preventing potential environmental hazards and maintaining the continuity of service, even when severe conditions arise.



Community Benefits

These new emergency provisions reflect West Seneca's dedication to proactive disaster preparedness, making sure critical services remain accessible and functional when residents need them most. With winter's unpredictable weather on the horizon, these enhancements not only safeguard essential infrastructure but also provide peace of mind to the community, knowing that West Seneca is ready to handle the challenges of extreme weather with resilience and readiness.

The town encourages residents to stay informed about available resources and to familiarize themselves with the locations of emergency facilities.



SMALL CLAIMS

Small Claims is an informal court where individuals can sue for monetary damages only up to \$3,000 maximum in the Town and Village Court. Claims over \$3,000 but not exceeding \$5,000 can be directed to a City Court. The person or business you are suing MUST reside or have an office for business in the Town of West Seneca.

To start a small claim, you must come to the Court Office and complete a small claims application in which you will need the name and address of the party to be sued and the exact dollar amount. A filing fee of \$10 is required for claims up to \$1,000. A \$15 fee is required for claims \$1,000 to \$3,000. A future court date will be scheduled.

EVICTIONS

You can file your eviction paperwork with West Seneca Court. However, all evictions will be heard through Erie County Hub Court. Please contact the Court Clerk for a hearing date and docket number prior to preparing documents for service.


WINTER SAFETY TIPS & PREPAREDNESS HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT BRIAN ADAMS

With winter upon us, it's important to remember that while we can't predict exactly what Mother Nature will bring, we can take steps to prepare ourselves, our families, and our community for the colder months ahead. Over the past several years, our town has faced several major snowstorms and extreme weather conditions, and our Highway, Sanitation, and Building and Grounds Departments have been working diligently to ensure the town is prepared for whatever winter throws our way. From prepping snow removal equipment to maintaining safe roadways, our team is ready. However, winter weather can still pose challenges. To ensure your safety and the safety of others, we want to offer some important reminders and tips as we navigate through the season together.

- ⇒ **Monitor Local Weather Forecasts** for updates on road conditions and snowstorms. Stay informed and adjust your plans if necessary.
- ⇒ **Slow Down and Drive Cautiously**Winter driving conditions can be treacherous, especially after a snowstorm or during icy conditions. Roads may be slick, visibility may be reduced, and stopping distances are longer.
- ⇒ **Always reduce your speed** when driving in snowy or icy conditions. Even if the roads appear clear, black ice can form unexpectedly.
- ⇒ **Increase your following distance** to allow enough space between you and the vehicle in front of you. This extra space gives you more time to react in case the vehicle in front of you stops suddenly or if road conditions change unexpectedly.
- ⇒ Avoid Crowding Snow Plows

 Snow plows work to clear the roads, but they do so slowly and with caution. Do not crowd a snow plow or try to pass it. Snow plows often make wide turns, stop frequently, and may be operating in multiple lanes at once. If you find yourself behind a snow plow, stay at least 200 feet behind it to give the driver enough space to operate safely. If you need to pass, do so

cautiously, and only if the conditions allow for it.



Winter conditions can slow down traffic, so always plan for additional travel time. Whether it's getting to work, school, or an appointment, you may need to leave earlier than usual to account for potential delays due to snow removal or poor road conditions.



CHECKLISTS:

PREPARING YOUR VEHICLE

- Keep your gas tank at least half full
- Proper All Season or Winter Tires
- Clear snow and ice from your vehicle before driving, including your headlights, brake lights, and mirrors.
- ♦ Have an emergency travel kit

EMERGENCY KIT ESSENTIALS

- Cell phone and car chargers
- ♦ Flashlight with extra batteries
- Reflective or warning triangles
- ♦ First-aid kit
- Water and non-perishable food
- Traction aids (like salt or traction mats)
- Ice scraper or snow brush
- ♦ Shovel

The <u>West Seneca Senior Center</u> welcomes any Erie County resident age 50+. We are open weekdays from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM. Membership is <u>Free</u> and applications are completed on site. Anyone can access our <u>Monthly Newsletter</u> online or acquire a physical copy at our Center. Our newsletter features all our daily activities, limited-seating events, and special events.

<u>Lunch</u> is served at 12:00 PM, and members may reserve their lunch at least three days in advance. We host Erie County's weekly <u>Frozen Meal</u> program, <u>Going Places Van</u> senior transportation service, seasonal <u>University Express</u> classes, and the <u>Club 99</u> free fitness class. The FeedMore <u>Farmer's Market Food Truck</u> visits our Center every Tuesday from 10:00 AM to 11:00 AM selling fresh affordable produce.

Participation with our <u>Gym Fitness Center</u> and our daily <u>Fitness Classes</u> costs \$10.00 per month, but 88% of our members have this fee covered by their insurance. In addition to our weekday hours, the Fitness Center is now open on <u>Saturdays</u> from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM until 5/17/25. Our gym features a wide range of equipment, a walking track, and a <u>Golf Simulator</u> available by reservation. We also have <u>Pickleball</u> courts outside and an indoor playing area.

Our Main Ballroom features activities ranging from <u>Line Dancing</u> to <u>Tai Chi, Bingo</u> to <u>Pinocle</u> tournaments, and <u>Trivia</u> to <u>Parties</u> with live music. Our Library has friendly groups involved in <u>Puzzles</u>, <u>Knitting</u>, <u>Crocheting</u>, and <u>Mahjong</u>. Our Game Room hosts <u>Billiards</u>, <u>Chess</u>, and many fun <u>Card Games</u>. We have two classrooms which host <u>Ceramics</u> painting, <u>Watercolor</u> painting classes, <u>Greeting Card</u> design <u>classes</u>, the <u>Safe Driver</u> academy, as well as various information seminars.
